Co:Writer SOLO Edition by Don Johnston (http://www.donjohnston.com)

• The most commonly used word prediction program that recognizes inventive spelling and incorporates some great features like Topic and Genre Dictionaries and E-word Bank.

* Word Q by Quillsoft Inc. (http://www.wordq.com)

• This floating four-button toolbar can work with any computer application, allowing students to benefit from word prediction across programs. Uniquely, it provides examples of confusing words in sentences for easier selection.

Write:OutLoud SOLO by Don Johnston (http://www.donjohnston.com)

 Proofreading and editing made easier with text-to-speech, marked deletion, homonym checker and other features that combine auditory and visual cues in this talking work processor.

* Read & Write by TextHELP (http://www.texthelp.com)

• It is an application toolbar that can be used with word processors, spreadsheets, databases, email and the Internet.

* ReadPlease (http://www.readplease.com/)

 This text-to-speech program can be used for reading and writing. It is available for download free of charge.

* Inspiration/Kidspiration (http://www.inspiration.com)

• Kidspiration is an outlining program for grades K-5 while Inspiration is for grades 6-up). Students brainstorm their ideas using words and pictures and then transform their work into an outline form that can be uploaded into Word with just one click.

• This program supports students through the three steps of creating a first draft: organizing ideas, taking notes, and writing a draft. It includes an extensive collection of pre-designed templates for different forms of writing.

• This program allows students to create and print stories and books with words, graphics, and sound effects.
