

# Accessible Website Assignment

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## Goal

For this assignment, my goal was to develop an accessible website on the topic of Infant Sleep Safety.

## Website Elements

My site is located at <http://mason.gmu.edu/~droyer/072211/safesleep.html>. It consists of 4 pages that include the following elements:

- Skip Navigation
- At least one image
- At least one complex image
- A captioned video
- An accessible PDF file (extra credit) – this document

## Design Features

Using an external CSS style sheet, I created a common style for all of the pages. I used Arial font because it is an easy-to-read, sans script font. I used black text on a white background to eliminate any issues related to color blindness or sensitivity and to make the text as readable as possible. I checked my page for color blindness issues by printing it in grayscale to see if any comprehension was lost. I used minimal graphics, and chose ones that are clear and do not rely on color to be understood.

For my layout and Navigation, I kept each page simple, using headers and paragraphs to separate the sections. Each page has a skip navigation link in the upper left corner, followed by a toolbar of navigation links to each page of the website.

For the design, each page has a title, a link to contact me by email and the date it was last updated. The links I used connect information from other online sites and places bookmarked on other pages within my site. On the data.html page, I included a graph with an accessible data table below it. On the video.html page, I embedded a captioned video about sleep safety from youtube.

## Closing
