Goals Statement - Third Portfolio

As I worked on this final portfolio, I knew that I needed to pull together all of my coursework and professional activities as well as develop a plan for a possible dissertation. Because I was able to fully realize the completion of a pilot study during EDRS 812, I have been able to continuously think about a possible dissertation study and have really never stopped thinking about my dissertation since I have returned from Bath.

In this portfolio, I have updated my Research and Professional sections, vita, coursework and artifacts. During this final semester, I am completing my last two courses, one in a regular classroom and on in independent study as was decided during Portfolio 2. I have put an amended program plan to reflect the addition of taking Achievement Gap as an independent study. To help me with some of my dissertation reading, I have added some college readiness materials to the Achievement Gap course and found this reading a valuable addition in broadening my scope of understanding about how advanced academic programs like International Baccalaureate help students become better prepared for college level coursework.

In terms of goals for this portfolio, they are pretty simple.
