The video reviews address the topic and there are ample suggestions for improving the lesson. They address the cognitive, linguistic, and cultural diversity of the learners.	The video reviews address the cognitive linguistic and cultural diversity of the learners. They may not address the topic completely and/or they may lack suggestions for improving lessons.	The video reviews may not completely address the cognitive, linguistic, and cultural diversity of the learners. They lack suggestions for improvement and/or do not cover the topic completely.
